1. Enjoy car free activities

3. Stay, eat, buy and see local

Buying local produce gives you a flavour of the area, and helps to support local businesses. The Arnside and Silverdale area is a wealth of high quality locally-produced goods; food, drink and arts and crafts. Ask about local products and local & regional organic produce.

4. Reduce, reuse, recycle
